

- **Smith-Hermanson Music Center**
More than classrooms, the music building contains the music technology lab and electronic music studio (equipped for composing and editing music), the Recital Hall (set up for recording), 22 practice rooms with a piano in each, and rehearsal rooms for ensembles.
 - **Mitchell Theater**
Uniquely designed for flexibility in set design, Mitchell Theater is the site of all of Taylor Theatre's full-length productions throughout the year. Theatre students also have access to a black box theatre in Rupp Communication Arts Center, which they use for theatrical exercises and small, student-directed productions.
 - **Film & Media Production wing**
In the north wing of Rupp Communication Arts Center, you'll find the Film program's production studios, video and audio editing suites, live production control room, and the Mac lab.
 - **Modelle Metcalf Visual Arts Center**
38,000 square feet dedicated to visual art, MMVA holds a Mac lab equipped with Adobe tools and Wacom Cintiq tablets; studios for painting, drawing, and pottery; a printmaking room with all the necessary tools; a photography wet lab; gallery space, and more.
